African Islands Innovations: Powering Resilience and Sustainability

10th September 2025 11h30-13h | African Development Bank Pavilion | ACS-2, Addis Ababa

1. Background & Context

Africa's island states are on the frontline of the climate crisis, facing acute and intersecting vulnerabilities from rising sea levels, shifting oceanic patterns, extreme weather events, and accelerating biodiversity loss. Despite these challenges, they are also emerging as hubs of climate innovation and resilience, advancing locally led solutions grounded in indigenous knowledge, blue and green economy models, biodiversity conservation, and ocean- and nature-based development strategies.

To build on this momentum, the African Island States Climate Commission (AISCC) has been working to strengthen partnerships with key regional and international stakeholders, including the African Union Commission (AUC), Indian Ocean Commission (IOC), United Nations Economic Commission for Africa (UNECA), African Development Bank (AfDB), African Union Development Agency (AUDA-NEPAD), Green Climate Fund (GCF) and other vertical climate and environment funds, UN agencies, bilateral donors, and philanthropic foundations.

As a political and technical platform mandated by the African Union, AISCC plays a key role in championing the unique priorities of African Island States on climate finance, adaptation, and sustainable development, while advancing common positions in regional and global fora.



While the African Development Bank is advancing a dedicated, integrated approach to climate resilience in African Island States—tailored to their unique development needs and environmental realities—the AISCC and UNECA, with support from the Green Climate Fund (GCF), are implementing the RESIslands initiative. This pioneering platform unites nine member states—Cabo Verde, Comoros, Equatorial Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Madagascar, Mauritius, São Tomé and Príncipe, Seychelles, and Tanzania (Zanzibar)—to strengthen resilience through regional collaboration on climate innovation, risk management, and sustainable development.

This side event at the Second Africa Climate Summit will serve as a strategic platform to showcase island-led climate solutions, elevate the voices of African Island States and SIDS, and catalyze new partnerships to expand the RESIslands initiative. It will position African Island States as champions in regional climate resilience and innovation.

2. Objectives

- To spotlight innovative climate resilience and sustainability solutions being developed and deployed by African Island States.
- To amplify the AISCC led initiatives and the AfDB African Island States approach.
- To showcase RESIslands initiative as a strategic platform for inter-island collaboration and innovation exchange.
- To catalyze support from development partners, donors, and the private sector for scaling island-led innovations.
- To strengthen cooperation between African Island States and continental and global partners in advancing the SIDS climate agenda.

3. Expected Outcomes

- Increased outreach for the AISCC initiatives—including RESIslands and its country-led innovations initiatives, as well as AfDB, GCF and other partners projects with African Island States
- Strengthened political and development partner engagement for African Island States' climate agendas.
- Identification of opportunities for scaling innovations, financing, and cross-island collaboration.
- Affirmation of the role of African islands in continental climate leadership.
