



Institutional Strength

Sapacity building for climate action, annovation & industrialization: -



Assess National Context

- · Identify development priorities
- · Analyze emissions profile and key sectors
- Base commitments on evidence or identify capacity needs



Evaluate Policy Space & Trade-offs

- Define realistic ambition level (conditional/unconditional)
- · Assess co-benefits (green jobs, food security, etc.)
- Consider risks and frame with "just transition" principles



Align with International Cooperation

- Identify accessible international support and conditions
- · Leverage regional initiatives (AU, AfCFTA, etc.)
- Anchor in regional strategies for synergy and credibility



Incorporate Stakeholder Inputs

- · Consult ministries, subnational actors, private sector, civil society
- Ensure buy-in through participatory design



Assess Implementation Readiness

- Evaluate institutional capacity and policy instruments
- Review data and transparency mechanisms
- Identify capacity gaps and implementation roadmap

Decision-Making Process

The decision-making process is a framework that can be customized with an option of further elaboration for specific characteristics of countries

GST-1 Outcomes Relevant To Regional Organizations

- The GST.1 highlighted the critical role of enhanced international cooperation in addressing climate change:
 - Particularly in the context of sustainable development and poverty eradication,
 - Specially for countries with significant capacity constraints; and
 - For enhancing climate action across all actors of society, sectors and regions.
- GST-1 outcome calls on MDBs and other financial institutions to further scale up investments in climate action; and
- Calls for continued increase in the scale, and effectiveness of, and simplified access to, climate finance, including in the form of grants and other highly concessional forms of finance.
- Invites organization to provide capacity-building support for the preparation and communication of the NDC.2;

Regional Organizations Support Enhanced Climate Action In Africa

- African countries suffer lack of adequate, predictable and accessible climate support both finance and technology.
- Many countries also lack adequate information and knowledge about available support and lack technical capacity to access finance.
- Regional organizations expected role includes:
 - Take a lead in mobilizing and providing more coherent, coordinated and timely financial and technical support to the African countries
 - Assist African countries with provision and access to financial and technical support for the preparation of NDC.2
 - Integration of GST1 outcome in the context of the African countries development priorities and circumstances
 - Supporting African countries in the implementation and enhancement of climate actions over time
