





Leveraging Africa's leadership on Ocean Governance, Blue Economy, and Natural-based solutions

9:00 to 10:30 (UTC+4), 9 December 2023

The event will be jointly organised by the Africa-Europe Foundation (AEF) and the United Nations Economic Commission for Africa (ECA), in partnership with the FSD-Africa, with support from the African Union Development Agency - New Partnership for Africa's Development (AUDA-NEPAD).

Background and Context:

Africa has demonstrated unique leadership on ocean and the blue economy recently. It is fundamental to acknowledge the June 2023 <u>Moroni Declaration for Ocean and Climate Action in Africa</u> as well as September 2023 <u>Nairobi Declaration on Climate Change and Call to Action</u>, an outcome of the Africa Climate Summit (ACS). Such leadership must be understood and matched by the international community to elevate and strengthen cooperation and realise African's aspirations, as enshrined in the Africa Blue Economy Strategy (ABES).

The nature-based blue economy in Africa, emphasizing sustainable practices and ecosystem management, offers a lucrative opportunity. The blue economy, focusing on sustainable practices, research, innovation, and ecosystem management, has the potential to create 127 million jobs and generate 576 billion USD annually by 2063. An adequate national nature strategy aligned with international commitments could help address regional and increase funding and enhance climate outcomes where nature intersects with climate action.

The high-level side event will contribute to advancing a mutually beneficial vision and set of common priorities for Africa and Europe on ocean policy and action, including on the international stage at COP28, and in preparation of 2024, a key year for International Treaties, and revised AU programming. The event will pave the way for a collective sustainable future as Africa move towards the second decade of Agenda 2063 and the Europe enters a new policy cycle.

The shared ocean seascapes between and around Africa and Europe provide a strong basis for the development of a coordinated strategy across the two continents. It is time to elevate the ocean and the blue economy politically and financially. The sector represents a strategic domain of cooperation which is not yet central to the AU-EU dialogue – but one with immense potential.

On this occasion, the event will also launch the '**The Framework for National Nature Strategies'**, which aims to provide a structured and comprehensive guide for any country to develop their national nature strategy that can effectively assess the state of their natural environment, set clear goals and targets for conservation and restoration efforts, identify and prioritize initiatives, establish relevant policies and financing instruments, and create appropriate governance structures for successful implementation.







Objectives of the event:

(1) Celebrate African leadership on ocean and blue economy and highlight opportunities for strengthening cross-continental cooperation with Europe;

(2) Provide a platform to advance a mutually beneficial vision and a set of common priorities for the two continents on ocean policy and action, including on the international stage, towards strengthened cooperation, and understanding and trust;

(3) Serve as an incubator for new strategic and concrete initiatives, innovative practices, and to leverage mutual interest around ocean for the benefit of the Africa-Europe partnership;

(4) Showcase and rally African countries and their development partners around the *Framework for National Nature Strategies* as an innovative and integrative tool to boost nature-positive actions to realize national and global biodiversity, climate change and other natural capital goals;

(5) Stimulate partnerships and discussions to strengthen Africa's leadership on blue economy, nature conservation and restoration, as a fundamental component of climate resilience in Africa.
