Impact on communities

- Frequent and or repetitive droughts and floods in the region
- Displacement
- Migration/cross border movement
- Over stretching of resources
- Extreme weather event, temperature, dust storm
- Livestock loss, Crop failures, pasture loss
- Social protection network and systems breakdown
- Mental health issues
- Tensions between communities



Impact continue

- Protection concerns-GBV, CP, school dropouts, Ncoping, FS,
- Food insecurity
- Disease outbreaks
- Pastoralist drop out, ending in camps, towns,
- Fire- unknown situations, fire accident



Fire Incidents

Long periods of hot and dry weather have made grasslands and rangeland extremely susceptible to fires. In recent periods, such incidents have become more common in different parts of Somali region, and locals have low awareness of such disasters. In January, two cases were reported:

1 Bercano Woreda, Shebelle Zone

Fire on 29/1/2025 in a pasture land of a dairy farm, successfully extinguished with no injuries



Harorays, Fafan Zone

2 Qalafo

Fire destroyed nine homes and their properties, no human casualties



Kelafo(jaqdher), Shebelle Zone

3 Harorays Woreda, Fafan Zone

Fire on 28/1/2025 in 10 hectares of agricultural land in Abdi Kabajan district, controlled with no injuries
