Information note for participants

The twelfth session of the Africa Regional Forum on Sustainable Development will be held at the United Nations Conference Centre in Addis Ababa from 28 to 30 April 2026. The present document contains general information on meeting arrangements that may be helpful for those making travel arrangements and participating in the session.

In order to keep costs down and protect the environment, this information note will be available in electronic format only. Additional information on the twelfth session of the Forum is provided on a dedicated web page of the Economic Commission for Africa (ECA) (www.uneca.org/eca-events/arfsd2026).

Forum overview

The theme of the session is “Turning the tide: transformative and coordinated actions for the 2030 Agenda and Agenda 2063”.

Preliminary events and side events will be held from Saturday, 25 April, to Thursday, 30 April, at the United Nations Conference Centre in Addis Ababa, located in the ECA compound.

More information is provided in the draft programme of work (ECA/RFSD/2026/3), which is available on the aforementioned dedicated ECA website.

Visa and immigration requirements

All meeting participants travelling to Ethiopia must hold a passport that is valid for a minimum period of six months from the date of intended entry and that contains at least two consecutive empty visa pages.



To assist participants in obtaining visas upon their arrival at Addis Ababa Bole International Airport, the secretariat of the Forum must receive the following documents at least 15 working days in advance:

- (a) Copy of passport (must be valid for at least six months beyond the expected date of entry into Ethiopia);
- (b) Flight details (arrival and departure);
- (c) Name of the booked hotel.

Participants who intend to request a visa upon arrival at Addis Ababa Bole International Airport should carry with them their personal official letter of invitation and a copy of the note verbale listing the session participants, for presentation to the airline staff at the check-in desk at the airport of departure and to the Ethiopian immigration authorities upon arrival. The application fee for a single-entry 30-day conference visa is \$52.

For the issuance of journalist visas, the application procedure is the same as described above (see www.evisa.gov.et/information/journalistvisa).

ECA will send a note verbale to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Immigration, Nationality and Vital Events Agency of Ethiopia to facilitate the issuance of visas upon arrival for all confirmed participants. The note verbale will be shared with confirmed participants to support their request for a visa. Participants must submit a copy of their passport as soon as possible to ensure that their names are included in the note verbale.

Sponsored participants should take note that visa fees are already covered in the daily subsistence allowance and will not be reimbursed.

Holders of diplomatic and service passports or a United Nations laissez-passer will receive a free visa upon arrival.

Bank receipts for money exchanged at the airport must be kept securely, as they may be requested by officials at the airport upon departure.

Airport reception

Officers from the ECA Protocol and Liaison Services Unit, Ethiopian protocol authorities and representatives of the Ministry of Finance of Ethiopia will be available at the airport to provide you with assistance as needed, such as in relation to immigration formalities and luggage retrieval. Addis Ababa Bole International Airport is located close to the city centre.

Airport transfer

Participants should contact their hotel to arrange their transfer from the airport to their hotel.

Hotel accommodation

All participants must contact hotels directly to arrange and confirm their bookings. Special United Nations rates for hotel rooms are available for participants staying at the hotels listed in annex I of the present information note. The deadline for confirming reservations at those hotels is two weeks before the start of the session. Reservations that have not been confirmed by that deadline will be released. The hotels will then accept accommodation requests only on the basis of room availability. All participants are kindly requested to note that ECA will not be in a position to arrange hotel accommodation if participants fail to make their own arrangements beforehand.

Delegate accreditation

Government delegations are requested to submit to ECA their letters of nomination, duly signed by the appropriate authorities of their respective Governments, at their earliest convenience, but no later than Wednesday, 15 April 2026. The letters must indicate the names, titles and contact details of the representatives nominated to attend the meeting and can be submitted online using the link provided in the invitations sent by ECA.

Registration and identification badges

Online registration

Registration is done online through the link to the Indico platform provided in the invitation letter. Participants are encouraged to register well in advance, and no later than Wednesday, 15 April 2026, to ensure that credentials and visas can be processed and that badges can be issued as quickly as possible. The online system makes it easier to log the details required from participants and facilitates logistical preparations.

Badges

Access to the Forum venue is restricted, and a valid badge must be presented to gain entry. Forum badges will be issued at the registration counter located at gate 2 of the ECA compound from 25 to 30 April 2026.

For security reasons, a valid badge must be worn at all times and be shown to gain access to the Forum venue and meeting rooms. Lost badges must be reported immediately at the registration counter.

Facilities and services

Accommodation for persons with disabilities

In the spirit of inclusion contained in the Sustainable Development Goals, the organizers will take measures to make the Forum accessible for persons with disabilities. Participants who require special assistance should send an email to eca-arfsd@un.org to enquire about the ways in which the organizers can best support them.

Internet and a paper-smart approach

ECA will adopt a paper-smart organizational approach during the twelfth session of the Forum. Participants are strongly encouraged to use electronic media as much as possible, and every effort will be made to reduce the number of documents printed. To help to achieve this objective, high-density wireless connectivity will be made available at the Forum. The Wi-Fi Internet network name and password will be made available in visible locations in the Conference Centre.

Documentation

Given that the Forum is a paper-smart event, only electronic versions of Forum documents will be made available to participants. All Forum documents will be available via the ECA paper-smart portal (<https://papersmart.uneca.org/meeting>) and on the web page dedicated to Forum documents (www.uneca.org/eca-events/arfsd2026/Documents). Those who are attending the event in person are advised to bring their own devices (e.g. laptop computer, tablet or smartphone) to download and view the documents.

Working languages

The working languages of the twelfth session of the Forum are English and French. All documents, as well as interpretation for all sessions of the Forum, will therefore be available in both languages.

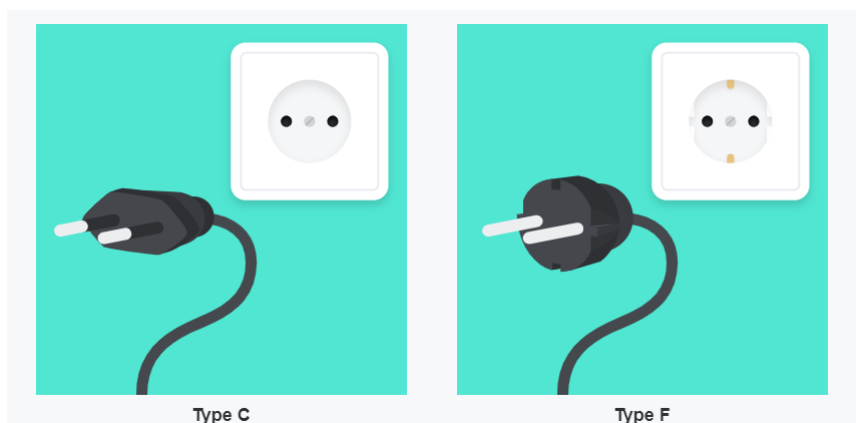
Practical information

Currency

The official currency of Ethiopia is the Ethiopian birr. One United States dollar is equal to approximately 150 birr. Credit and debit cards, such as American Express, Diners Club International, Mastercard and Visa, are accepted in Ethiopia. Automatic teller machines (ATMs) are also available.

Electricity supply and voltage

The electricity supply in Ethiopia is 220 volts with a frequency of 50 Hz and alternating current (AC). Plug types C and F are used, as depicted below.



Mobile phone services

Ethio Telecom and Safaricom are the main mobile phone companies in the country that offer prepaid SIM cards, and they have roaming agreements with partners in many countries. Customers must register their SIM card in order to activate it. Registration can be done at the time of purchase. Customers must present their passport when purchasing a SIM card from authorized vendors. SIM cards and airtime can be purchased at the airport or the conference venue.

Health requirements

Addis Ababa is located at an altitude of 2,400 m above sea level, which may cause altitude sickness in some people. Persons who have experienced altitude sickness in the past should reconsider whether they need to travel to Addis Ababa or consult their physician to obtain appropriate medication for the condition. The risks related to altitude sickness are higher for individuals with multiple health problems (comorbidities) and can result in serious health consequences. Participants should discuss their health issues with their physician before embarking on the trip.

Participants are advised to ensure that their vaccinations are up to date at least four to six weeks before travelling to Ethiopia. Vaccination against yellow fever is required for travellers who have departed from or transited through a country with a risk of yellow fever transmission no more than six days before arriving in Ethiopia. Participants should check the validity of their vaccination card and update it accordingly.

A medical team with an ambulance will be on standby at the United Nations Conference Centre in Addis Ababa to provide first aid, emergency care and stabilization. Participants who develop serious medical emergencies can be transferred to the referral hospitals listed in annex II.

The United Nations Health Care Centre, which is located on the premises of the ECA compound, is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. It provides outpatient care and emergency services, including ambulance services, to conference participants throughout the duration of the meeting. The Centre can be reached through the following emergency number, either by calling direct or via WhatsApp: +251 92 990 8433. All services provided at the United Nations Health Care Centre are provided on a fee basis.

A list of hospitals and clinics in Addis Ababa where participants may seek medical assistance is provided in annex II.

Media accreditation

All media representatives will require accreditation from the host Government and the Forum secretariat.

All invited sponsored and self-sponsored media representatives travelling to Ethiopia must register online at <https://indico.un.org/event/1022422/registrations/>. Once their registration is approved by the organizing team, they will receive an official invitation letter to facilitate the visa application process. Media representatives residing in countries without an embassy or consulate of Ethiopia will be advised on the procedures for attendance once their registration has been approved.

Invited media representatives will be required to submit a letter of assignment and one valid form of identification (e.g. a press card, work identification card, driving licence or passport) as proof of their media affiliation to denekews.uneca@un.org. These items should also be presented upon check-in at the media registration desk in Addis Ababa.

A media centre will be set up at the meeting venue to facilitate media coverage of the Forum. More information will be communicated directly to registered media representatives.

Media representatives travelling from outside Ethiopia will be required to fill in an equipment form to facilitate customs clearance. The form will be shared upon request; such requests should be sent to denekews.uneca@un.org.

Media representatives based in Ethiopia may register on site, in which case they will need to present their letter of assignment and passport or other form of identification at the designated media desk at the meeting venue. On-site registration will open on Saturday, 25 April 2026. Participants are advised to contact denekews.uneca@un.org closer to that time for more information on the exact location.

Security advisory

Addis Ababa is a relatively safe city for travellers and conference activities. The Government of Ethiopia will provide security services at the meeting venue and hotels.

Participants and visitors are advised to remain security-conscious, stay alert and vigilant, maintain a low profile, avoid going anywhere alone when possible, avoid going out at night and report any incidents immediately to the security team.

While at the conference venue, participants should adhere to the following guidelines:

- Conference badges should be worn visibly and shown to any authorized person who asks to see them.
- Bags and parcels must not be left unattended, as they may be confiscated and destroyed.
- Unauthorized persons, including children, must not be brought into the conference facilities.
- Participants should take care of their valuables.
- Participants should ensure that they have all their documents and personal items before they leave the conference halls and meeting rooms.
- Participants should inform the Security and Safety Service or an on-duty security officer if they lose anything valuable.

Participants should adhere to the following safety advice in relation to their hotels:

- Guests should always lock the door after entering and leaving their hotel room.
- Guests should inspect their room before they go out to ensure that no money, jewellery, cameras or other valuables are visible. Any such items should be deposited at the reception desk, in return for a receipt, or be left in the safe in the hotel room.
- Any suspicious or unusual activity should be reported to the security personnel immediately.

About Ethiopia

Ethiopia is an expansive, landlocked country in the Horn of Africa. Its capital city, Addis Ababa, is situated at an altitude of 2,400 m. Ethiopia is a multi-ethnic State in which 83 languages and 200 dialects are spoken. Agriculture is the backbone of the national economy, and the principal exports from this sector include coffee, oil seeds, pulses, flowers, vegetables, sugar and animal feed. About 90 per cent of the population earns a living from the land. There is also a vibrant livestock sector, exports from which include cattle, hides and skins.

The Ethiopian government has announced an official ban on single-use plastic bags, effective from 31 January 2026. The prohibition extends to both the production and the sale of single-use plastic bags.

Information on selected tourist sites in Addis Ababa is provided in annex III.

Climate

Ethiopia has two main seasons. The dry season is from October to May, and the rainy season starts in late June and ends in September. Temperatures vary depending on the season and altitude. At the end of April in Addis Ababa, expect mild to warm days and cool evenings, with daytime highs around 24 degrees Celsius and nighttime lows around 11 degrees Celsius. While April is generally warm, it marks the beginning of the smaller rain season, with about 13–14 days of rain expected throughout the month. With that in mind, participants may wish to bring a light, waterproof jacket.

Time zone

The time zone is GMT+3 all year long.

Selected tourist attractions in Addis Ababa

<i>Attraction</i>	<i>Description</i>
National Museum of Ethiopia	A centre of history and culture in the capital, the National Museum of Ethiopia charts the ancient legacy not just of Ethiopia but of all humankind. The museum features many archaeological artefacts discovered locally, such as fossil remains and skeletons. It also displays many works of art by Ethiopian artists, alongside ancient relics of some of the first-known hominids and ethnological artefacts from across the centuries.
Holy Trinity Cathedral	Construction of this massive and ornate cathedral began in 1936 and was completed in 1944, during the reign of Emperor Haile Selassie I. It is one of the best-designed churches in Ethiopia and is notable for its architecture, decoration, spaciousness and splendid stained-glass windows. In addition, it is the burial place of Haile Selassie and many other dignitaries. There is also a small museum on the grounds, housing over 140 religious manuscripts, icons, ceremonial items, paintings, umbrellas, crosses and books dating from as far back as the fifteenth century.
Entoto Natural Park	Part of the Beautifying Sheger project, Entoto Natural Park is a highland park that sits nearly 3,000 m above sea level. The large park is spread out across an often sunny but cold and windy mountain and has many high-quality cafés, restaurants, hotels and even a new art museum within its grounds. The brainchild of the Prime Minister of Ethiopia, Abiy Ahmed, Entoto Natural Park is now among the most attractive places in Addis Ababa. Many world-class Ethiopian athletes train in the park.
Unity Park	Unity Park is home to the National Palace, which is a whole world unto itself. There are many things to see and experience in Unity Park, including nature, wildlife, history and architecture. It is a place where visitors can come face to face with more than a century of Ethiopian history.
Science Park	A new addition to the capital, the ultramodern Science Park is a unique building in Addis Ababa, and has become a tourist attraction. Located next to the National Palace and Unity Park, the museum contains 30 interactive exhibits on a wide range of scientific fields. The rooftop viewing platform is an excellent vantage point from which to enjoy the modern skyline of Addis Ababa.
Merkato	“There is nothing that you cannot find in Merkato!” say the locals. And it’s true. Merkato is the biggest open-air market in Africa, where thousands of entrepreneurs and street traders sell every commodity imaginable. Although the stalls and shopfronts may seem unappealing from the outside, transactions worth billions of birr are conducted there every day.
