THE ZAMBEZI RIVER PLENARY</li> <li>Investing in the Peace-Security-Development Nexus: Needs, Opportunities and the Way Forward</li> <li>85% of Africa's 1.3 billion people at present live in a country affected by conflict, or in a neighbouring country. Violence and fragility are well-established barriers to economic and social progress, while rising security expenses can crowd-out fiscal space for social spending. In this context, the African Development Bank (AfDB) is exploring innovative approaches to raise additional financing at scale, including through capital markets, for investments that contribute to peace and security. This plenary session provides an opportunity for the audience to receive an update on the Security-Indexed Investment Bond (SIIB) Initiative, which analyses how a development finance institution can collaborate with other stakeholders for this purpose. THE MANO RIVER PLENARY</li> <li>Preventing and Responding to Complex Political Transitions including Unconstitutional Changes of Government in Africa</li> <li>What is driving the recent surge in military coups in Africa? What existing national and regional mechanisms are in place to mitigate the risks of, and effectively respond to unconstitutional changes of government, including military coups in Africa?</li> <li>To address these questions, this panel will build on ongoing primary research by UNDP, based on interviews with 9,000 respondents in countries where recent military coups have occurred as well as countries where there is evidence of democratic processes taking root. It will also offer concrete proposals on how to enhance programmatic responses to prevent and respond to varying forms of complex political transitions through the African Facility to Support Inclusive Transitions (AFSIT). The Facility is being co-created by UNDP, the AUC and development partners to support countries experiencing complex political transitions, including unconstitutional changes of government.
