1. What is the connection between human rights and the SDGs?

- 2030 Agenda is grounded in international human rights law
- The SDGs "seek to realize the human rights of all"
- Agendas are "interrelated and mutually reinforcing"
- Pledge to "leave no one behind": equality and non-discrimination

Human rights norms and obligations: a "guiding star" for SDG implementation



2. What is the international human rights monitoring system?

- Key human rights mechanisms at UN level:
 - Treaty monitoring bodies
 - Universal Periodic Review
 - Special Procedures of the Human Rights Council
- Common elements:
 - Periodic State reporting and reviews (visits)
 - Issuing guidance and recommendations
 - Principles: transparency, participation & inclusion, accountability



3. What is the benefit in connecting human rights reporting and monitoring with the SDGs?

- Human rights monitoring system holds a wealth of knowledge about "leaving no one behind"
- Human rights mechanisms produce action-oriented guidance
- States and other stakeholders can leverage synergies when tracking progress and drafting reports

- Capacity-Building Programme offers support through regional presences and digital tools
- Building capacity of National Mechanisms for Reporting and Follow-up
- Established & strengthened more than 70 NMRFs worldwide

NMRFs are key institutions to make the link with SDG reporting and follow-up.




Universal Human Rights Index
